– Enjoy a garden visit and Devonshire Tea at John and Lorraine's cottage garden and orchid house at Eastwood. Bookings Essential.




This is a short, concentrated course for real beginners to be held in January.

Recipe of the Month

Soup recipe from the U3A Cookbook

Pumpkin & Bacon Soup

(1) 50 Minutes



Ingredients

1/4lb (120g) Diced Bacon 1 large Onion

1 tsp Curry Powder

2lb (lkg) Pumpkin A pinch of Nutmeg

4 Chicken Stock Cubes

Salt and Pepper to taste

Method

2 tsp Sugar

Combine all ingredients in a large soup pot

Cover with water Bring to simmer

Keep at simmering and cook for 45 minutes

Puree and gradually add milk to achieve desired consistency

Add cubed potato and carrot for a creamier soup
